The cards were posted by recorded delivery so we can track and watch the journey of a package as part of our topic. In numeracy we progressed to calculating change with the P3s giving change up to £1 and the P4s progressed to giving change from £5. On Tuesday afternoon we had a virtual trip to Chester Zoo and watched a live video about why animals are different colours and the importance of some animals being able to camouflage.
