

Our teacher says...

'This has been a great week in P1/2. We have been continuing our Autumn theme and the boys and girls have loved playing in our new 'Percy the Park Keeper' role-play area. We have also been making numbers out of Autumn items eg. Conkers, acorns, leaves etc. In PDMU we have been thinking about healthy eating and we made faces out of fruit. 'We have been very busy this week with our topic work 'Minibeasts'. We designed and created mini gardens out of shoeboxes and placed minibeasts where you might find them in the garden. Have a look at our mini gardens on display outside the classroom - they look fantastic! In Literacy, we have been focusing on alphabetical order, ordering minibeasts - lots of pupils were able to put words in alphabetical order using the 2nd and 3rd letter of each word. In Numeracy, we were subtracting multiples of 10 from 2-digit numbers. We also started to double numbers up to 10 and even progressed to strategies to double 2 digit numbers, hundred numbers and thousand numbers! 'We have been looking at a variety of diary entries this week, identifying the key features and language. They have started to plan their diary entries which are focused on being lost in the rainforest. There have been some interesting and imaginative ideas which is great! In numeracy we have been recapping and developing our times tables knowledge and trying to develop a quicker recall through practical activities and calculating multiplication and division questions. Keep encouraging children at home to go over their times tables, they could maybe show you the game we played this week too! Our topic focus this week has been looking at the different rainforest animals and sorting them into reptiles, amphibians, birds and mammals.' Miss Doyle P4/5

'We've had a week full of fun and hard work in P6/7. In maths, we have been practising our division using the 'bus shelter' method, and we have realised how important it is to know our times tables to help us with this! In literacy, we selected our favourite book and wrote our own book review, using interesting writing techniques such as alliteration, WOW words and rhetorical questions. We are continuing to develop our ball skills in PE and have edited spreadsheets to calculate wages in Victorian times using Microsoft Excel.' Mrs Irwin P6/7
