

In P.E we were moving like these animals so we had great fun pretending to scurry like mice, fly like bats and jump like toads. In Numeracy this week, P1 have started learning all about the number '1'. We found lots of places in our classroom and around the school where the number '1' was displayed. At home, why don't you have a look for lots of different numbers in the environment? P2 have been putting objects in order using the words 'first, second, third etc.' We went to the garden for the first time this week and loved exploring the willow dome, making music with the outdoor instruments and peeking into the fairy windmill. 'We have been writing creatively this week using an image of an unusual creature. They had to set the scene and describe what they could see and predict what was happening. Some interesting reads and great imagination. In numeracy we have been using our fraction knowledge to calculate fractions of amounts and to solve word problems. We have been learning about numerators and denominators. We now know how important our times tables are especially when working with fractions. We have been looking at different rainforest animals and working in pairs to conduct research. We have recorded and created animal fact files. This was the final week of 'Healthy Kicks'. The children thoroughly enjoyed these sessions, delivered by Mark and have learnt the importance of being healthy and keeping fit.
