

## Our teacher says...

'P1/2 have had a great week. We have enjoyed 'show and tell' each day, listening to our friends talking about their favourite toys. There have been some very exciting toys this week! Our toyshop roleplay corner has been very popular and the boys and girls have been providing excellent customer service to all the customers who have come in to visit. In Literacy, we read the story of 'Dogger' and we decided to make 'lost toy' posters to help Dave find Dogger when he got lost. The children had some great ideas and were able to use the iPad to make the posters; you can see them on the school website. Have a lovely weekend and I'll see everyone on Monday!' Miss Best (P1/2)

P3 pupils wrote a fantastic weekend recount on Monday, showing excellent detail and improvements from last week. We looked at adjectives this week and were able to identify and use adjectives to improve our sentences. In Numeracy, we focused on directions. We were able to give directions on a map using forward, back, left and right as well as use grid references to locate countries on a map. We started our Activity Based Learning this week; creating Lego landmarks from around the world, a small airport with arrival and departure times, designing country flags and completing a map of the world jigsaw. For our topic we were learning about the United Kingdom and located where we live on a map. In ICT, we designed Christmas jumpers! Excellent work P3! 'P4/5 have been looking at features of poetry this week including 'In Flanders Fields' and wrote their own acrostic poem for Remembrance Day. They have also been making good progress with their weekly comprehension tasks. In numeracy P4 have been rounding to the nearest 10 and 100 whilst P5 have been rounding to the nearest 100 and 1000. Excellent effort from all children. We have also been recapping our time skills including analogue and digital times. In ICT we have started to create informational brochures about the rainforest and have started our rainforest shoeboxes in art. Another busy week with lots of hard work and fun!' Miss Doyle (P4/5)

'This week in Numeracy, P6/7 have been getting to grips with decimals, comparing and ordering numbers of up to three decimal places. In Literacy, they have been producing super work, as they have planned and written letters as the character of Jim Jarvis from our class novel, 'Street Child'. Some excellent creative ideas were contributed in the planning process, with the pupils really imagining what Jim's thoughts and feelings would be while trapped in the workhouse.
