'We have had a busy week. We really enjoyed our trip to Bagenal's Castle on Wednesday when we got to learn about Christmas in the past. Our favourite part of the trip was the toy room! The elves had been busy putting out toys from the past and from all over the world. We saw marbles made out of stones and the very first doll, which was just a stick of wood. We saw toys like spinning tops and jack in the boxes, and it was so much fun being allowed to play with these! We want to say a big thank you to all the staff at Bagenal's Castle for looking after us so well! We read a poem called Rocket Horse and decided to write our own verses that contained rhyming words. 'P3 continued with their direction work this week. We focused on those tricky right and left turns using the bee-bot. We were able to move the bee-bots around a map of the UK, giving directions to our partners to different cities. We completed lots of long subtraction sums with no exchange. We also began to recognise 3D shapes. For Literacy, we continued reading our class novel 'The Demon Dentist' and came up with lots of creative ways to stay awake during the night! We completed our weekend recount on Monday with all pupils showing impressive independent writing. We were getting into the Christmas spirit by using chalk to complete a lovely Christmas tree through a window design - check them out outside our classroom! Our Show and Tell session with our favourite toy was very good with each child speaking clearly about their toy. I wonder will the Elf on the Shelf be visiting P3 on Monday?! 'This week P4/5 have been busy writing their letter to Santa which they completed beautifully for our Christmas display board. We have also been looking at homophones including there, their and they're as well as to, too and two. In numeracy we have continued to focus on money including calculating the total cost and change. P4 and P5 have found calculating the change a little tricky, maybe they could help mums, dads and grandparents when paying for items in the shop next time to test their newly learnt skills. 'This week in P6/7 we continued our work on 2D shapes. We explored shapes to find lines of symmetry, internal angles and pairs of parallel lines. We were also able to find lots of examples of right angles and parallel lines in the classroom. We also learned about the cardinal and intercardinal points of the compass and discussed different mnemonics we can use to help us remember them. In Literacy, we looked at how writers take a new line and indent for a new speaker. We then practised this by writing arguments in pairs. Some very creative and humorous work was produced - super!
