



We have been working on homophones again focusing on 'where', 'were', we're' and 'wear' as well as completing comprehension about Advent. We have been using our times tables again this week for completing division with and without remainders. A good start for the P4s dividing with remainders. P5s have also been getting on great with lots of extension work completed. 'This week's Numeracy topic in P6/7 has been adding and subtracting decimal numbers. We realised how important it is to lay our calculations out accurately, using the decimal point as a guide. Using decimals is also very useful when dealing with money, so we can keep track of our Christmas spending! In Literacy, the pupils produced some excellent Christmas poems based on their senses, thinking about what Christmas looks, smells, sounds, feels and tastes like. We included lots of special writing techniques, such as alliteration, rhymes and similes. Certainly some budding poets in the class!
