

Our teacher says...

'P1/2 have had a great start to term 2. We have started our new 'Bears' topic and we love it already. We read Goldilocks and the Three Bears and have spent the week making produce play dough, making Goldilocks puppets and putting on puppet shows. We also played in the Three Bears' Cottage role play area and made chairs and beds for the Bears out of LEGO. On Monday we finished off our 'Toys' topic by making old toys out of wood. We got sticks and used whittling tools to scrape off the bark. It took a lot of concentration and perseverance but everyone did a great job and learned how to be safe with the tools. 'P3 have been learning about money this week! We were working with coins up to £1, laying out coins for a given value and counting coins. We designed our own moneyboxes and have been working hard throughout the week in order to collect coins to use in our Sweet Shop in the classroom. We also looked at half past times. In Literacy, we were able to write all about our Christmas holidays. We focused on using 'a' and 'an' correctly as well as recapping verbs. Our new class novel will be Millionaire Boy and we were thinking all about the things we would buy if we were a millionaire! In PE we focused on invasion games. 'P4/5 have settled back into the new term and have been recalling key events from their Christmas holidays by writing a recount. We have also focused on developing our comprehension and have been reading about the New Year and traditions around the world. Numeracy this week has focused on rounding to the nearest 10 and 100 within a 3 and 4 digit number for P4 whilst P5s progressed to rounding to the nearest 1000. Our new topic is 'Ancient Egypt' and our class novel is 'There's a Pharaoh in Our Bath' written by Jeremy Strong. The children have updated their targets for the new term and have recalled the importance of school rules and following instructions to help with their learning.' Miss Doyle (P4/5)

'It's lovely being back with P6/7 and everyone has settled back into class well after the break (teacher included!). In numeracy the pupils continued their work with decimals and learnt how to round decimals to the nearest whole and tenth. Our topic this term is 'Ourselves' and to begin we learnt about the major organs in the body and their function. We've also had a number of other lessons linked to our topic. In literacy we've begun to write bio poems (short structured poems about ourselves) and in art P6 have been drawing self-portraits while P7 have been busy creating a PowerPoint about themselves for their ICT.
