

Our teacher says...

'We had an extra 15 members of our class this week as P1/2 brought their bears to school! We have had so much fun using them in lots of different activities. We painted pictures of them, measured how tall they are, talked about them during circle time and finished off with our Teddy Bears' Picnic today! P1/2 learned that is important to wash our hand before preparing food, then we got down to making our ham sandwiches, chopping our fruit and making our iced buns. We cut our sandwiches into different shapes such as rectangles, squares and triangles. Miss Best brought in her guitar and we had a sing-song, then some musical games before the bears got tired and they had to go to bed. The other big even this week was our 'My First Riddle' competition. Every P1/2 entered the competition and each of the riddles was fantastic - there were some very creative ideas! 'This week in P3 we were focusing on measuring using centimetres and metres. Lots of practical work measuring small objects and larger distances around the school. Check out the school website for pictures. In Literacy, we looked at speech bubbles and designed our own cartoon version of Jack and the Beanstalk. We continued to read our Billionaire Boy class novel and will finish this off after half-term. Unfortunately, Shared Education was cancelled on Wednesday however we had fun moving around all the STEM stations in school. Have a lovely break and well-earned break.' P4/5 have created Ancient Egyptian necklaces using paper plates. We drew our designs then painted them which took a lot of concentration. In literacy we wrote descriptively about a funfair using our senses and tried to incorporate the key features we have learnt this term. In small groups we revised key grammatical features and designed posters which we will add to our class literacy display. We spent time revising our subtraction and addition skills to answer questions mentally alongside developing a quicker recall of our times tables. During PE we focused on our thinking and problem solving skills to create different shapes and patterns based on oral description. We love to play 'Miss Doyle Says' which helps to test our listening skills! It's been a busy half term in P4/5. The children have continued to work hard, have made super progress and are eager to please which is brilliant. Have a well deserved rest over the holidays!' Miss Doyle (P4/5)

'In literacy we've continued with our focus on explanation writing and all week we've been busy producing an extended piece of explanation writing about how the digestive system works. The pupils worked very hard on these, spending time planning, writing and redrafting. In numeracy we are coming to the end of our focus on decimals and we have been learning how to convert between decimals and fractions. To link in with Valentine's day, we decided to learn about the heart. We learnt about the names of the different parts of the heart and the journey blood goes on.
