

Our teacher says....

'P1/2 have been busy this week as we have been learning all about shapes. We have learned the names of both 2D and 3D shapes during Number work and then we went on a shape hunt around the school looking for these shapes in real life. At playtime we consolidated this by printing with 2D shapes, making pictures out of 2D shapes and using 3D shapes in construction. I wonder how many 2D and 3D shapes you can see at home? On Tuesday we made delicious pancakes and enjoyed a whole range of toppings on them. Afterwards we designed our own pancake toppings and made a list of the ingredients we would need, then made a pictogram of our favourite toppings. We had one more part of our bears topic to finish off - den building! Mrs Murtagh helped us build life-size dens outside and we had to do a lot of teamwork because the materials were often big and heavy. Well done!' Miss Best (P1/2)

'P3 have been looking at Venn Diagrams this week and sorting information using two criteria. We started with pictures before progressing onto number sorting. Yesterday, we created our own Venn Diagrams and collected information from the P4/5 class to record. We continued our focus of speech marks this week alongside looking at our new topic of pirates. We finished our class novel Billionaire Boy yesterday. We have really enjoyed reading this book and look forward to starting our new class novel next Monday. 'P4/5 have had a busy week recapping instructional writing to write a set of instructions that we then used on Tuesday to make our own pancakes which were delicious! We have also been learning to use an apostrophe accurately in our writing to show possession and also when writing contraction words. During numeracy we have been looking at data handling, we collected data using tally and frequency tables and presented it on bar charts and pictograms then answered a range of questions. We collected data on our favourite pancake topping and also asked the P1/2 children and some of the P6/7 children which ice cream flavour was their favourite. We used some of our PE time to collect data related to our favourite sporting activity and presented the results using a Venn Diagram. Our topic focus this week has been on 'Mummification' and the process to perform this. We are looking forward to learning about Tutankhamun next week.' Miss Doyle (P4/5)

'P6/7 quite literally put their thinking caps on this week, as we made brain hats as put of our topic learning. By making our brain hats we learnt about the different parts of the brain and what each part controls. We also took part in lots of fun brain games and were amazed at how our brains work! With Pancake Tuesday came some pancake related work. In literacy the pupils were tasked with describing a stack of pancakes using adjectives, verbs and similes and of course, we had to sample some delicious toasted pancakes with a choice of toppings to help us in our descriptive writing! On Wednesday we were busy building and crafting as we worked with our Shared Education partner school to start creating our models, showcasing our learning from our local area trips. In maths, this week we have begun learning about percentages and how to convert between fractions, decimals and percentages.' Mrs Weir (P6/7)
