

On Monday we looked at fact books about dinosaurs and made fact files about different types of dinosaurs, and the children have loved bringing some of their own dinosaurs into school to play with in the dinosaur land at playtime! "This week we have been completing calculations including addition and subtraction mentally. We also focused on data handling and completed tasks as part of our term 2 assessments. During literacy we focused on good punctuation and the use of adverbs in our writing. In small groups we started to create our Ancient Egyptian artefacts using recycled junk. Last week each group chose the artefact they wanted to create and drew a plan and decided on possible materials they could use to create their artefacts.
